2010 FREQUENTLY ASKED QUESTIONS



1. What is the football league structure?

The ACYA has a grade based league structure. Players will be placed in the league based primarily on their grade for the 2010 – 2011 school year. They must also meet the age criteria. Please note the age cut-off date is August 31, 2010.

The **Intra-League (IL)** is comprised of five leagues with players from 1st grade to 7th grade. All of these teams play at Murphey Candler Park. The typical IL roster will have between 15 and 17 players.

The **Division 1 Atlanta Colts** are part of the North Metro Football League (NMFL). The Colts compete against teams from other parks throughout the metro Atlanta area (Alpharetta, Roswell, Sandy Springs, and Forsyth County).

2. How do I sign up? What is the deadline?

Online registration is open - follow the links at www.atlantacolts.com. Regular registration ends May 31st. You can also register during in-park registration days or

download a registration form from the website. Football registration will be limited to a maximum number of players per league. When the limit is reached, a waitlist will be formed. There were many kids left on the waitlist in 2009. Don't get left on the sidelines.

3. What is the late registration fee? Late fees apply after May 31st.

Flag Football = \$100
*Cheerleading = \$175
Football = \$365
**Family Cap = \$0

**Cheerleaders will be required to purchase a uniform package (\$60 for Intra-League, \$210 for D1 Colts) during registration.*

***The Family Cap is not offered after May 31st.*

4. When does the season begin/end?

The Calendar of Key dates is available at www.atlantacolts.com/calendar.php.

The tentative schedule is below.

Late July:

- FB conditioning begins for 4th to 7th grades
- Colt Cheer practice begins

Early August:

- FB Evaluations begin for 4th to 7th grades
- IL Cheer practice begins

Mid August:

- FB Evaluations begin for 1st to 3rd grades

Early September:

- Flag players begin

Games begin late August/early September.

Regular season games will end in late October followed by Playoff and Championship games in mid November.

5. What am I responsible for purchasing? What does the league provide?

Flag Football: ACYA provides team shirts and flags. Players can wear football cleats or athletic shoes.

Tackle Football: ACYA provides team jerseys and use of shoulder pads, helmets, chin straps and team decals for each player. It is the player's responsibility to purchase a mouthpiece, practice jersey, practice and game pants with thigh and knee pads, socks and cleats. Each player should wear an athletic protector/jock strap and/or a protective cup.

Cheerleading: ACYA provides a t-shirt and shorts set which is the **required** uniform for practice. Cheer uniforms must be purchased through the park. All cheerleaders should have a separate pair of shoes for practice.

The cost of the Colt uniform package is \$225. It includes a uniform, body suit, bloomers, warm-up suit, socks, shoes, and a hair bow.

The cost of the Intra-League uniform package is \$60 and will include a uniform and bloomers. The cheerleader will need to purchase white leather athletic shoes for games. The IL cheerleaders will be instructed on game shoes once practice begins.

6. What other expenses should I expect?

The team/squad on which your child plays or cheers will ask you to contribute "dues" - usually \$20 to \$60 per child. The dues increase with the age of the child. These dues are used by the team/squad to pay for incidentals, coaches' gifts, a team party at the end of the season, etc. The collection and disbursement of team/squad dues is the responsibility of the team/squad parent.

7. Does my child need experience to play or cheer?

No, ACYA welcomes children at all levels of experience.

8. Is financial assistance available?

Financial aid is available on an as needed basis. ACYA asks for an agreed upon contribution toward the fees. Apply for a scholarship by mail or during an in park registration day. *The scholarship does not*

cover team dues, cheer uniform, or necessary equipment. These are the responsibility of the scholarship recipients.

9. Can my child play football and fall baseball at MCLL?

Generally, yes. The schedule of practices and games will be expanded this season. There may be an occasional conflict between a MCLL event and an ACYA event.

10. How is the registration fee used?

In addition to the equipment for each individual player/cheerleader, the registration fee covers the operation and maintenance of ACYA's use of Murphey Candler Park. While Murphey Candler is a DeKalb County park, ACYA pays for virtually all of the operating costs. This includes field maintenance, utilities, insurance, officials, and cleaning supplies. In addition, ACYA funds the majority of capital improvements.

11. What sort of time commitment is expected of me as a parent?

Every parent is expected to volunteer. ACYA is 100% volunteer organization. A parent, guardian, or care giver is expected to stay at the park with your child during all practices and games.

12. What if a player misses part or all of evaluations?

ACYA understands that football starts long before the summer is over. If your child will miss part or all of evaluations, please contact the appropriate league director. Contact information can be found at www.atlantacolts.com/board.php.

13. How are the football teams selected and cheerleading squads formed?

Following one week of evaluations, the Division 1 coaches select the Colt teams. Participation on the Colt teams is by invitation only.

The IL coaches evaluate the remaining players and conduct a draft to ensure the equitable distribution of talent. To promote competitive balance and to ensure a safe experience for the boys, ACYA reserves the

right to assign players to a league more befitting their size, speed or ability.

Once teams are drafted, cheerleading squads are formed. Special requests are considered for siblings only if doing so does not pose a safety risk to the squad.

14. I have more than one child in the program. Can their schedules be coordinated (i.e. same team & squad)?

Much depends on the grade and age differential between the siblings. The IL football teams are formed based on grade, age, and ability. While ACYA will try to accommodate special requests, the first priority is team equity. The Division 1 Colt teams are formed by invitation only.

All cheerleading squads are based on grade. Girls in Kindergarten through 2nd grade will cheer for our Pee Wee teams. Starting in 3rd grade, girls will cheer for the same grade teams.

15. Are there minimum play rules?

The IL rules call for each player to play at least half of every game. All of our Pee-Wee players are assured of carrying the ball at least one time during the season. There are no minimum play rules for the Colts.

16. Where can I find a copy of the football rules?

The North Metro Football League (NMFL) plays under the National Federation of State High School Associations (NFHS) rules. These rules are used by all GA High Schools. You can find more information at www.northmetrofootball.com.

17. How often, when, and where are practices and games?

Flag Football:

- One Wednesday night a week for 6 weeks
- Practices and Games on Colt or Mustang Field
- Games at 5:30 or 6:30

Intra-League: *Schedules are subject to change.*

- Practices are held on the baseball or softball fields at Murphey Candler.

- Games are played at Murphey Candler Park on Mustang or Colt Field.

Preceding the first game of the season:

- All IL football teams practice two to four nights per week for two hours.
- Cheerleaders will usually practice on Tues and Thurs nights for one hour.

Once games begin:

- Pee Wee football players and cheerleaders will only have two events per week – a practice and a game.
- The 3rd to 7th grade leagues will practice two nights per week plus a game during the week or on Saturday.

Division 1 (ATLANTA COLTS):

- Football practice is three nights per week for two hours. There may be practice on Sunday.
- Cheerleaders practice three nights a week for two hours until the first game. Then practice is two nights a week for two hours.
- All Division 1 games are played on Saturdays starting as early as 10:00 and as late as 6:00.

18. Will I have to provide my child's birth certificate?

Birth certificates are only required for Division 1 football players. Division 1 cheerleaders may be required to submit a birth certificate if participating in a cheer competition.

19. Who should I contact if I'm interested in coaching?

ACYA is committed to attracting and retaining coaches that will model behavior reflective of high moral character, ethics, and sportsmanship. To that end, ACYA will choose carefully the persons to lead and influence our youth. ACYA has instituted a mandatory coaching evaluation and training program.
